
## **Adelaide Hills 2016**

## Adelaide Hills summary - 2016

- ★ The Adelaide Hills reported crush was 27,670 tonnes in 2016, 20% higher than the 2015 reported crush and 21% above the five year average of 22,864 tonnes.
- ★ The total value of grapes from the region increased by 25% from \$30 million to \$37.5 million.
- ★ The average prices for the major red varieties increased – with Pinot Noir up by \$184 per tonne. There were small increases in Chardonnay and Pinot Gris while the weighted average price of Sauvignon Blanc fell slightly.
- ★ There were just 13 hectares of new plantings in 2015, while the total vineyard area decreased by 47 hectares to 3,818 hectares.
- ★ Average gross returns per hectare\* for the major varieties ranged from \$7,181 for Shiraz to \$15.573 for Pinot Gris.
- ★ Average gross returns in 2016 were higher than in the previous two years for the major varieties except Shiraz.

\*calculated as total tonnes divided by plantings up to 2013, multiplied by weighted average price

Note: these gross return figures are conservative as only reported tonnes are included in the calculations. The non-response rate is estimated at 10% nationally. Bonus payments not known at the time of the survey are also not included.
