

Coonawarra summary - 2016

- ★ The Coonawarra reported crush was 35,497 tonnes in 2016, 30% higher than the 2015 reported crush and 23% above the five year average of 28,867 tonnes.
- ★ The total value of grapes from the region increased by 30% from \$36 million to \$47 million.
- ★ The average prices for all the major varieties except Chardonnay increased after significant decreases in 2015.
- ★ There were 77 hectares of new plantings in 2015. The total vineyard area increased by 52 hectares to 5,823 hectares, against a trend of net decline in most regions in 2015-16.
- Average gross returns per hectare* for the major varieties ranged from under \$5,000 for Merlot to over \$9,000 for Shiraz, with the main variety Cabernet Sauvignon at \$8,314 per ha on average.
- Average gross returns in 2016 were all higher than in the previous two years (except Sauvignon Blanc) due to the increase in price and yield.

*calculated as total tonnes divided by plantings up to 2013, multiplied by weighted average price

Note: these gross return figures are conservative as only reported tonnes are included in the calculations. Bonus payments not known at the time of the survey are also not included.
